CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

• Entries must be lodged by 31 March 2024. • Entrants must be Australian citizens or permanent residents. • The manuscript must be the entrant's first authored book, however entrants may have edited books and authored chapters within books • The manuscript submitted with the entry form should be a legal work of an academic or practical nature. It is acceptable for the book to be any of the following: a scholarly text, a student textbook or a text for legal practitioners. • The manuscript must be a minimum length of 80,000 words and a maximum of 120,000 words, including footnotes, endnotes and references. • The manuscript must be an original work and entirely by the entrant. • It cannot be under consideration by any other publisher or award. • No more than 10% of the manuscript can have been previously published in print form, or in electronic form, on a commercial basis. • The Federation Press will publish the winning entry, and may offer to publish any other entry they feel is of suitable merit. • The judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into. • The judges shall have the discretion to divide the prize equally between authors of entries they consider to be of equal merit. If, in their opinion, no entry is worthy of the prize, no winner shall be chosen. • Each entrant is required to agree to the above conditions of entry. • Breach of any conditions of entry will render an entry invalid.
