THE HOLT PRIZE 2024

Now in its fifth year, The Holt Prize continues to recognise excellence in unpublished legal works of an academic or practical nature. The joint winners of the 2024 Holt Prize were announced on 1 November 2024. The \$12,000 prize will be shared equally by Dr Vanessa Ho for her entry *Facilitating Appropriate Forum Choices in Transnational Intellectual Property Litigation* and Dr Julian R Murphy for his entry *Constitutionally Protective Statutory Interpretation*. Both entries will be published by The Federation Press in 2025.
